# Sermon: Grounded In Truth

### Passage: 2 Peter 1:12-21 (ESV)

### Illustration:

Need: Christians can navigate this dark world only as we pursue Christ by repeatedly going to the light of God's Word.

### I. The Need for Repetition (1:12-15)

- Approx. 90% of what is heard is forgotten only 1 hour after being heard. Repetition is the key.
- Peter's goal in writing was to repeat, remind, believes of who they were, the dangers they would face and the glory to which the needed to continue pressing towards. (Deut. 6:6-9; Phil. 3:1)
- As long as Peter had breath and ink, he was committed to repeating the essential truths of the faith!

#### II. The Truth About the Truth (1:16-21)

- False teachers were accusing the apostles of teachings about Jesus to be that of make-believe and myth.
- Peter defends the apostolic message by way of eye witness testimony.
- Early Christian history tells us that all of the apostles, except for John, were executed for maintaining their eye witness testimony of the risen Jesus.
- He then points believers the sure testimony of written Scripture that serves as our directional light (lamp Ps. 119:105) in this world until Jesus, the Morning Star, returns!
- Isa. 55:10-11; Ps 119:89; Prov. 30:5; Matt. 5:18; Matt. 24:35; Heb. 4:12; 2 Tim. 3:16
- 2 Peter 1:20-21 are two of the most important verses in regard to the doctrine of Scripture.
  - Scripture, God's written Word, is sourced in God and not man.
  - God used human authors and human styles to produce His divine special revelation.
- False teachers deny the INSPIRATION, INERRANCY, & AUTHORITY of scripture.

#### **III.** The Doctrinal Essential

- "The Bible alone is authoritative. It is inspired and inerrant in the original documents."
- INSPIRATION the supernatural process by which God influenced the biblical writers to record the words of Scripture, there by rendering it the Word of God.
- VERBAL INSPIRATION all the words, word forms, combinations of words, and wording of the Bible are Gods divine intention for Scripture.
- PLENARY INSPIRATION the doctrine that divine inspiration extends equally to all parts of the Bible.
- INERRANCY without error; the doctrine that the Bible in its original manuscripts was free from error and/or contradiction.
- AUTHORITY the doctrine that the Bible is actually God's Word and is the only source in this day for divine revelation.
