# Series: Ephesians: Christ's Life In Us

### Sermon: Marriage Basics

#### Passage: Ephesians 5.15-21

#### Illustration:

Need: Before we can explore Paul's instructions to husbands & wives we must first understand the basics of marriage.

#### I. Marriage was God's idea. (Gen. 2:18-24)

- To complete what was lacking by design.
  - The language of helper is not of a "sidekick" or lesser individual. "Strong helper" more accurately describes the woman. Strong where he is weak, weak where strong.
  - Man & woman are created equal in worth and importance but distinctive in design, characteristics, and function.
- To introduce intimacy and oneness through covenant.
- Humans in the community of love in loving relationship with their triune Creator for His glory!

#### II. Marriage was broken by sin. (Gen. 3:16, 20)

- Sin corrupted and broke the sinners as well as all of the created order.
- In the man, care giving love was replaced with domination. In the woman, completing strength was replaced with competition for control.
- Seeking to have "my needs" met with someone "compatible" became the greatest motivation.
- Marriage has been constantly devalued and often completely disregarded in human history, especially in pursuit of the deceptive "soul-mate."
- Selfishness dominates, 50-50 philosophy, endless expectations, all withdrawals and no deposits, etc.
- (Gen. 3:21; 4:1) Marriage remained sacred & a means of God's blessing even after sin.
- Marriage, though broken, remained God's sacred vehicle for intimacy, reproduction, and reflection of His own unique oneness in community.

#### **III.** Marriages experience transformation in the gospel.

- We are confronted by our own individual broken self-centeredness.
- We are set free from slavery to sin and made free to live with and for others more than ourselves.
- We are empowered by the Holy Spirit to love others sacrificially as Christ loves us.
- We are able to see and imitate the sacrificial love of God as displayed in the life and death of Jesus.
- We are able to understand marriage through the lens of mutual submission and sacrificial love.
- We are given a unique arena to practice vulnerability and transparency.
- We are given a unique arena to have and be an authentic friend.
- We are given a unique arena to experience God's desire for Christian community, the church.
- We are given a unique arena to practice the "one anothers" prescribed to followers of Jesus.
- We are given a unique arena to disciple and be discipled as we pursue Christ together for each other.
- We are able to reflect the message of the Gospel to the watching world as we practically live out our roles in the marriage.
- We are able to reflect the image of God as we mutually submit to one another. (Eph. 5:21)
- We are able to reflect the love relationship between the Savior, Jesus, and His bride, the church. (Eph. 5:32)
