Sermon: Heavy Instructions for Humble Servants

Passage: Luke 17:1-10 (ESV)

Illustration:

Need: Jesus instructs His followers about addressing with sin in the ranks and restoring those who fall into it.

I. Beware of your affect on others (1-3)

- temptations to sin = stumbling blocks (NASB), offenses (KJV) are inevitable/unavoidable.
- Jesus refers to those leading others away from Him by false teaching and issues a strong warning/Woe.
- Disciples must "Pay Attention" so they don't also lead others toward sin/stumbling.

II. Remember your responsibility to others (3-6)

- Rebuking sin is a pointed Reprimand in hope of Repentance in order to Restore/Forgive.
- Six steps of responsible rebuke:
 - 1. Go certain of the sin. (2 Cor. 13:1)
 - 2. Go certain it is indeed sin. (Acts 17:11)
 - 3. Go having sufficiently prayed. (Eph. 6:18-20)
 - 4. Go humble & gentle with the goal of restoration. (Gal. 6:1; Jam. 5:19-20)
 - 5. Go one-on-one, next with 2 or 3, last before the whole church. (Matt. 18:15-17)
 - 6. Upon repentance, eagerly forgive and restore not necessarily to past roles.
- Sins against us personally should, with repentance, result in unlimited instances of forgiveness.
- We never look more like our Father than we do when we forgive.

III. Cultivate an attitude of humble service (7-10)

- When we obey heavy instructions we should not see it as worthy of personal honor.
- Humble servants are grateful for the opportunity they have to serve. [More about that next week]

IV. Put it to work:

- 1. Pursue truth and share truth recognizing your life is a powerful example.
- 2. Responsibly rebuke your brother's & be ready to repent when your brother rebukes your sin.
- 3. Be excited to forgive and restore those who repent of sin.
- 4. Determine to remain humble and faithful in your obedience to Christ.
