Passage: Luke 4:14-30 (ESV)

Introduction: Set the Scene (Luke 4:14-15)

The Anointing (Luke 4:18a)

- The intent of anointing is to be set apart for divine use. To do the work of God.
- By definition and act of anointing is to smear our even cover with oil.
- With the anointing comes protection Psalms 105:14-15; 1 Sam 26:9
- With the anointing comes provision Luke 4:1 He was full of the Holy Spirit
- With the anointing comes direction Luke 4:1 He was led by the Spirit
- With the anointing comes power Luke 4:14 in the Power of the Spirit
- Christ means "the Anointed One"

The Message (Luke 4:18b-19)

- To proclaim good news to the poor
- To proclaim liberty to the captives
- Recovery of sight to the blind
- Set at liberty those who are oppressed
- Proclaim the year of the Lord's favor

The Decision (Luke 4:20-30)

- Marveled at His Words
- Doubted His Position
- Rejected His Truth

Practical Application
