Introduction: Set the Scene (Luke 4:31)

- I. Authority (Luke 4:32)
- a. What is Authority?
- i. The power to determine, adjudicate, or otherwise settle issues or disputes; jurisdiction; the right to control, command, or determine.
  - ii. a power or right delegated or given; authorization
- iii. a person or body of persons in whom authority is vested, as a governmental agency
- b. Experts in sociology would tell you there are three types of authority
  - i. Charismatic
  - ii. Traditional
  - iii. legal-rational
- II. Power (Luke 4:33-37)
- a. What is Power?
- i. Power refers to the ability to have one's will carried out despite the resistance of others.
- ii. You can have power without authority, but you cannot truly have authority without power.
- iii. You can have authority and power, but it may not extend past your center of influence.
- III. Jesus demonstrates His Authority and Power
- a. Jesus is not interested in what satan has to say and neither should you.
- b. Satan is a liar and the father of it. (John 8:44)
- c. This demonstration of power over Satan and the demons reveals His ability to deliver sinners from their grasp. They are under His Authority.

- 3. To some you are the authority; to others you concede authority.
