Sermon: Beautiful Forgiveness

Passage: Luke 7:36-50 (ESV)

Illustration:

Need: There is nothing more beautiful than a hopeless sinner who receives total forgiveness and peace from our loving and gracious God and Savior!

#### I. A Broken Sinner (7:36-38)

- It would not have been unusual for an uninvited guest to drop into a home where a rabbi was staying.
- The guests at the table leaned forward with their feet extended behind them.
- Her weeping showed her <u>sorrow</u>, her posture showed her <u>submission</u>, her use of her hair showed her <u>humility</u>, her kisses revealed her <u>love</u>, and her use of the expensive ointment showed her <u>honor/worship</u> of Jesus.

### II. A Pompous Critic (7:39-40)

- The Pharisee, we will learn, is named Simon (not to be confused with Simon the leper in Mt 26 & Mk 14).
- It is unknown what motivated Simon to invite Jesus into his home.
- Through his lens of self-righteous judgement he surmised the unworthiness of the broken woman as well as defining Jesus as a false teacher from Nazareth.

# III. A Revealing Illustration (7:41-47)

- Love for Jesus depends on one's self-awareness of sin and a belief in His ability to change it.
- Denial of one's own sinfulness results in contempt for the broken and a disinterest in the Good News.
- No one has less sin debt than anyone else. All are helpless in their need of forgiveness.
- The woman knew her need was great and came broken to Jesus seeking God's mercy.
- The Pharisee considered himself to be sufficiently righteous and intentionally dishonored Jesus by withholding common hospitality.

#### IV. A Forgiving Savior (7:48-50)

- In Luke 7:34 the Pharisees called Jesus "a friend of tax collectors and sinners."
- Jesus demonstrated acceptance of this woman but did not condone her sin.
- Jesus sees this woman through the eyes of love and grace and compassion.
- Jesus knew the need and the heart of both and would have forgiven them both but only one demonstrated repentance with faith in Him.
- Jesus again states His authority to forgive sins as he had done in Luke 5:20. This forgiveness was based in the eternal facts of His sacrificial death and bodily resurrection.
- That broken woman went home forgiven with peace in her heart!

## V. Put it to practice!

- Learn repentance and sorrow over sin, and worship and love of Jesus from the broken woman.
- See what self-righteous judgement looks like from the pompous critic.
- Demonstrate the kind of grace and love and acceptance to others that you also received from Jesus.
- Come to the Savior to receive that same complete forgiveness and peace today.
